Kick-off for **2017 Bishop's Appeal** is next weekend. The second collection next weekend is for the Appeal. This year St. Margaret Mary has been given a goal of \$18,424.95, which is the same as last year's. Last year Parish exceeded this goal by 112.10%, due to your support for the various programs to which our Diocese is committed: religious and faith formation in the Diocese, the formation of future priests of the Diocese, Catholic schools in our area, and supporting parishes in need. For 2016, the Diocese raised \$2.3 million which is nearly 94% of the goal.

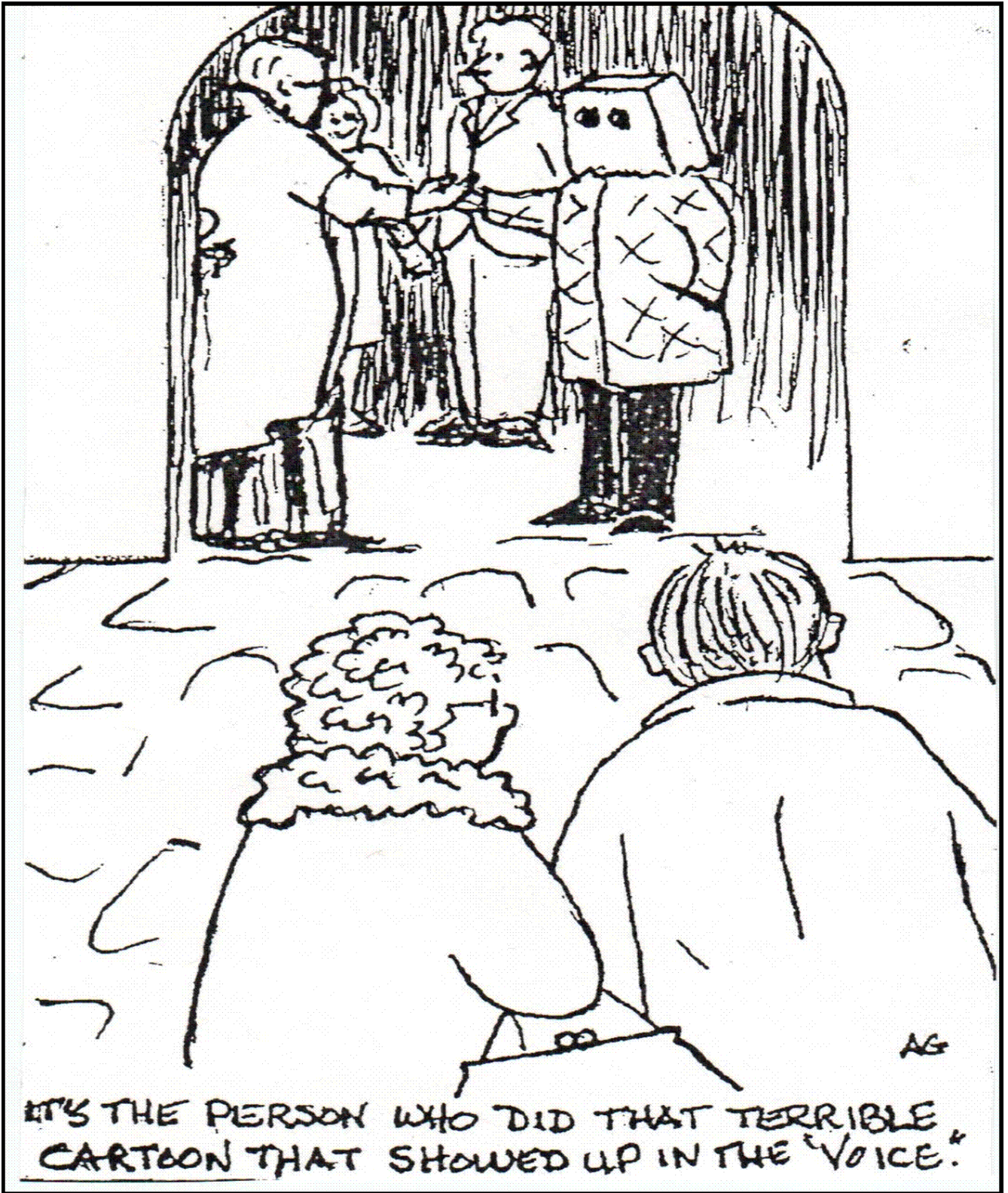

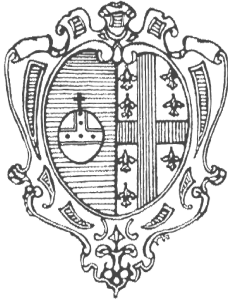

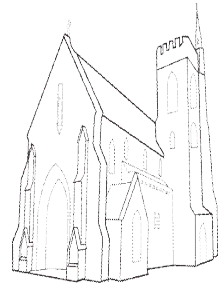

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS EXTRAORDINARY FORM

to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration" (Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI, July 2007) or an exploration into the theological, historical, devotional, liturgical, ritualistic, architectural, artistic, linguistic, practical, legalistic, mystical... aspects of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

COMMUNICANTES 2

Twelve more martyrs are mentioned during the Canon. Shedding their blood, they followed Our Lord in His Sacrifice. They are vivid images of the Sacrifice of the Cross. They are part of the Mystical Body of Christ (that is why relics of martyrs are literally buried inside the stone of the Altar).

They are all well known martyrs of Rome. Linus, Cletus and Clement were contemporaries and assistants of St. Peter. They are his three successors. The three first popes.

Sixtus and Cornelius were also popes and martyrs.

Cyprian, born in Africa, was bishop of Carthage (Tunis). His letters are well known. He had a great desire to save souls and to offer his life by martyrdom.

Lawrence, deacon, burning in charity for the poor. During his martyrdom, he was placed on a hot grill. Story says that he found courage to ask his tormentors : 'I am well done this side would you do the other'.

Chrysogonus, illustrious Roman Martyr of Aquilea. Many Basilicas are named after him.

John and Paul are two brothers. They were killed in hatred of the faith by Julian the Apostate and secretly buried. That is only a few years later that their bodies were rediscovered and great devotion sprung from there.

Cosmas and Damian are two brothers, both doctors in medicine, whose charity match their fame. We find Cosmas and Damian mentioned in Asia, Arabia and Italy. Rome carries a very long standing tradition claiming that they died in the City.

Et omnium sanctorum. The Communion of Saints is one of the most remarkable dogmas of the Revelation. By divine design, it is through the merits and the prayers of the saints, and because of their unity with the Passion of Christ, that we can make profit of God's protection.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
