## MESSAGE FROM FR. GLENN NAGUIT:

The Diocesan-wide kickoff for **Bishop's Appeal 2017** is this weekend. The goal set for us this year is \$18,424.95, which is the same as last year's. We were one of the 36 parishes out of 82 that reached its goal last year. Many thanks for your continued support for Bishop Barber.

The Bishop's Appeal provides funds to offset some of the following expenses:

- Parishes and Schools in Need: \$913,000
- Pastoral Ministries and Services: \$2,031,000
- Clergy Formation and Retirement: \$3,511,000
- Religious Education and Formation: \$1,014,000

Many of you will be receiving envelopes and pledge cards in the mail directly from the Diocese. I haven't received mine yet, but when it does, let's respond generously to Bishop Barber's appeal.

Additionally, many choose to contribute to through the second collection. We will have 10 second collections (including this weekend's) throughout this year for Bishop's Appeal 2017.

I spoke with Phil Toups, the interim Executive Director for the Diocese's Office of Mission Advancement recently and he confirmed that, yes parishes will still receive the excess of any amount over its goal made in its name. So, an investment to Bishop's Appeal is also an investment to St. Margaret Mary.

Some of you are still making good on your pledge for the **Capital Campaign**. I'd like to thank you for your commitment to the Diocese and to St. Margaret Mary.

The Bishop has chosen as a theme for this year's Appeal: "All God's People – United in Faith." All of us who worship Almighty

God at St. Margaret Mary every Sunday—regardless of what time you go to Mass and regardless of where you live (whether within or outside the Diocese) are nonetheless part of, and are in union with the rest of the Church in Oakland. Our support of Bishop's Appeal is our opportunity to help this local Church, for we are all in this together, united in the same one faith in Our Lord Jesus Christ.

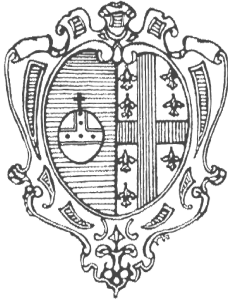

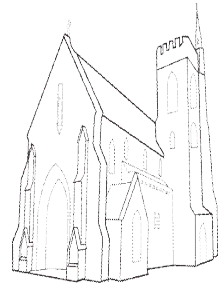

**A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS  
EXTRAORDINARY FORM**

*to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration" (Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI, July 2007) or an exploration into the theological, historical, devotional, liturgical, ritualistic, architectural, artistic, linguistic, practical, legalistic, mystical... aspects of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.*

**HANC IGITUR: PART I**

The priest extends his hands above the Chalice

The use of holding hands above the chalice dates from around 1500. The previous habit was to raise the hands or to bow profoundly as saying the prayer in a sign of humility. But it is believed that this is very ancient since it is referring to the sacrifices of the Old Testament where priest would extend their hands toward the victims offered for sins.

Denys the Carthusian says: "The priest put his hands on the victim to express more vividly his intention and devotion, attracting God's attention." This gesture meant as well that the priest substituted the victim to himself to die in his place for his sins. Eusebius insists then that priests and faithful must desire to be offered and to destroy in themselves whatsoever could displease God and to dedicate themselves entirely and without restriction to His service. That is the sense of the prayer.



“O Lord, we beseech Thee graciously to accept this oblation of our service and that of Thy whole household. Order our days in Thy peace, and command that we be rescued from eternal damnation and numbered in the flock of Thine elect. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

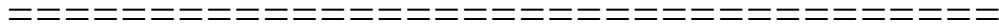
We remember that the priest, previously, on his own and on behalf of the faithful, presented the Sacrifice in

union and communion with the whole church, on earth and in heavens. He now begs that this communion will lead this sacrifice to be well received. It is indeed as members of the community, all together, that we pray.

Servitutis nostrae. Servus is our proper title. We are servants of the Creator. The pope, since Gregory the Great (6th century) designs himself as the Servant of the servants of God. We are servants of God in many ways. We are totally dependent of God and have been redeemed, bought back through His Passion. The priests and members of the clergy have an urgent need to recognize themselves as servants remembering the vocation that is theirs...priest is not alone. He is linked with all his family, *cunctae familiae tuae*. He is reminded here of his responsibility to be a father of God's children.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
