Lenten reflections by Bishop Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet (1627-1704) are available. His great piety and simple eloquence won him renown as one of the greatest preachers of his time. From

Bishop Bossuet's sermons and spiritual writings, believers drew ever greater Lenten wisdom and strength.

Translator Christopher Blum has selected from Bishop Bossuet's voluminous works fifty brief but remarkably powerful meditations that complement the daily readings at Mass during the Lenten season, thus offering to us the perfect companion for a thoughtful and fruitful Lent.

If you read and meditate briefly on just one of them each day in Lent, this good French bishop's eloquence will soon have you not merely remembering the events of Christ's journey to His Crucifixion; it will have you spiritually walking with Him on that journey . . . which is precisely what we are called to do in Lent!

With Bossuet, this Lent you will find yourself saying, "O Jesus! I present myself to you to make my journey in your company. O my Savior, receive your traveler! Here I am ready, holding on to nothing. Let me go with You to the Father."

That's the fire that should burn in the heart of all Christians. This Lent, let Bishop Bossuet enkindle it in yours.

The following regulations regarding fasting and abstinence are observed in the United States: Catholics ages 14 and over are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent. Individuals between 18 and 59 are also obliged to fast – eat one full meal – on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Eating two smaller meals is permitted if necessary to maintain strength, But eating between meals should be avoided. These

obligations, how ever, do not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be seriously affected.

The Lenten season is a special opportunity to grow spiritually through other penitential practices, especially those of self-denial, almsgiving, and through work of kindness and compassion.

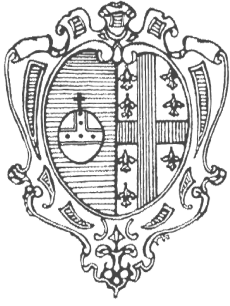

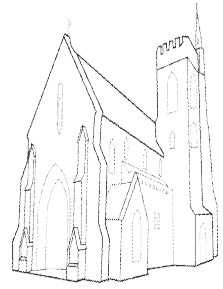

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS EXTRAORDINARY FORM

to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration"

(Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI)

HANC IGITUR: PART II

In the prayer of the Hanc Igitur, the priest insists on his personal and proper sacrifice. He offers himself with and through the victim.

It is remarkable that in this prayer the intention extends to the universal family of the church and not only to those here present as in the previous requests.

In the "Hanc Igitur" three important demands are made to God:

- in tua pace disponas. To be set in God's peace is the greatest thing that can happen to a soul. It is nothing to be compared with worldly peace based in sweet fulfillment of material goods and an appeased remorse from sins. The peace of God is based on the possession of His grace and His gifts. This peace sets the heart in deep joy that no tribulation can affect because it keeps us continuously united with our sovereign good.

- ab aeternae damnatione nos eripi. Having requested the greatest of all good, His peace, we claim protection from the greatest of all evil: eternal damnation. The danger and fear of hell is no small matter. The



Sacrifice of the Mass is the mean by which the Grace of God comes to our rescue. Without it no man could be saved.

- et in Electorum tuorum numerari. On God side, our election to eternal life is never affected. We are created to be eternally with God and God does not change His purpose. We are however feeble, sinners and in need to confirm ourselves, through his grace, in good works. We pray therefore to the Good Lord to assist us in the path of the saints to be eternally with them.

Let us pray constantly to be in God's peace, preserved from eternal death and to remain in His sanctifying grace.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
