During these remaining weeks of the Year of Mercy (which ends on Nov. 20th, the Solemnity of Christ the King), the faithful may obtain a **plenary indulgence** by passing through a designated Holy Door. The Holy Doors of the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland are so designated. This particular indulgenced act during the Year of Mercy may be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

In addition to this indulgenced act of passing through the Holy Doors, the remaining requirements for obtaining the indulgence applies. The remaining requirements include: offering the "Our Father" and the "Apostles Creed" in the visit to the church; praying one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the Holy Father's intentions (that is, the intentions designated by

the Holy Father each month); worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day if you can get to Mass); making a sacramental confession within 20 days. Lastly, for a plenary indulgence, befrom all attachment to sin, even venial sin (otherwise, the indulgence is partial, not plenary, “full”). God’s mercy abounds.

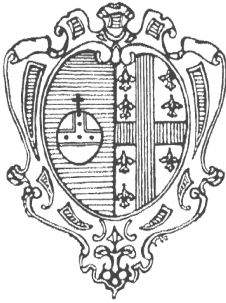

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS EXTRAORDINARY FORM

to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration" (Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI, July 2007) or an exploration into the theological, historical, devotional, liturgical, ritualistic, architectural, artistic, linguistic, practical, legalistic, mystical... aspects of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

'Hoc sacrificium Laudis', 'This Sacrifice of praise'.

As before, when we called the bread to be consecrated 'hostia immaculata', 'host without stain', we call what is still just bread, "a Sacrifice of praise" in advance, in view of the consecration, the Transubstantiation into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ who alone can be the worthy Victim offered to the Father.



Saint Hilaire (4th Century) explains that one can offer the sacrifice in two different ways. The first is the one we just explained, through the material offering of the matter of the sacrifice at large. This way every benefactor becomes part of the sacrifice. The second is the way by which the

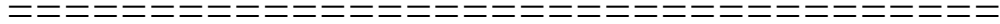
faithful offers the sacrifice to unite themselves in the prayer of the Priest who alone can do the ministerial offering. This second method is well illustrated by the celebration of ad orientem: faithful praying together with and behind the Priest to God. Both methods fit well the necessity of an 'active participation' at Mass.

Next week: 'Pro se, suisque omnibus', 'for them and for all dear to them'.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
