The **Solemnity of Christ the King** is a Holy Day in the liturgical calendar of the Roman Catholic Church. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI on 11 December in 1925 in his encyclical "Quas Primas". At that time he saw the rise of Atheism, Communism and Secularism as a direct result of man's turning away from Christ's sovereignty, and man's denying of the authority of Christ's Church. This result was "disorder" or a move away from the Divine Order.

The Solemnity was set on the last Sunday in October. After the Second Vatican Council, the calendar reforms of 1969 moved the date of the Feast of Christ the King to the last Sunday before the next liturgical year's Advent (Advent marking the start of the liturgical year (this year December 2). Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas Day. Before this change, the Sunday before Advent bore the designation "Last Sunday After Pentecost" and had its own special Mass), regardless of the number of Sundays there were between Pentecost and Advent (23 to 28) in that particular year.



Thanksgiving Day is meant to be more than a single day on which we express thanks. Originally, it was intended as an occasion to show appreciation for the abundant harvest season. We have literally thousands of reasons to be appreciative. Our litanies of thanksgiving would normally include: good health, plenty of food, a fine home, a caring family, loving friends and a strong country. Then, there are all the wonderful freedoms we possess as citizens of the United States. The list is practically unending. How easy it is to take them all for granted and never reflect or recall where our blessings originated. Who died that we would have these many benefits? Who has been especially good to us? Have we, or how have we, said thanks? The Old Testament recommends spending not only a day for celebrating thanksgiving but 7 weeks each year. Jesus asks us not only to be thankful but to express our thanks. If you would to have blessed some of the food items that you will use for your Thanksgiving, you may bring them with you at Mass in order to be blessed. Let the priest know.

The Church has her own special liturgical year and calendar in which she presents the history and mysteries of our salvation, from Creation to the

Second Coming, together with the entire life of the Savior. Each Sunday and feast will present a special lesson to us for our daily living. The **First Sunday of Advent** is therefore the Church's "New Year's Day". In the Judeo-Christian tradition, Sunday begins at sundown of the day before; when the faithful celebrate First Vespers. We start Advent on Saturday, November 27th with the Vigil mass at 5.00pm.



Spring Classes at the School for Pastoral Ministry are on offer. Explore the depth and beauty of the Catholic Faith at the **Saint Francis de Sales School for Pastoral Ministry**. 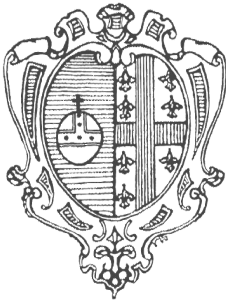

**A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS
EXTRAORDINARY FORM**

to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration" (Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI, July 2007) or an exploration into the theological, historical, devotional, liturgical, ritualistic, architectural, artistic, linguistic, practical, legalistic, mystical... aspects of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

'Pro se, suisque omnibus', 'for them and for all dear to them'.

Charity obeys to an order. Love your neighbor as you love yourself. This order of charity requires therefore



that we pray first for ourselves then for others. The same order requires as well, that we ask for the good of the soul before the care of the body. That is the reason why we say: pro

redemptione animarum suarum (from the redemption of their souls); pro spe salutis (for the

hope of their salvation); et incolumitatis suae (and for their safety).

These three goods come to us through Jesus Christ and His Sacrifice.

It is through this divine sacrifice that the sins of the world that make the souls prisoners of the devil are redeemed and freed : pro redemptione animarum suarum.

It is in Jesus Christ only that we can be saved. He is the one and unique Redeemer. It is in Him only that we have the firm hope of salvation: pro spe salutis.

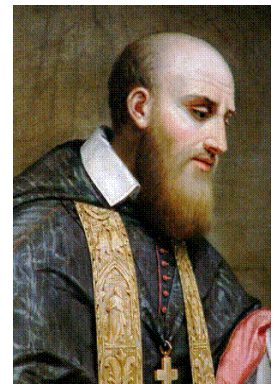
Lastly, through Jesus Christ comes all the other good including health. Our well being and safety is very precious and necessary to accomplish our duties. Our Lord brought back their health to many and scourged the nine lepers who did not return to give thanks.

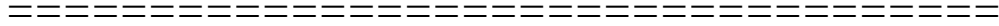
Constantly, the Church asks for good health in Her public prayers: Et incolumitatis suae.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
