During these remaining weeks of the Year of Mercy (which ends on Nov. 20th, the Solemnity of Christ the King), the faithful may obtain a **plenary indulgence** by passing through a designated Holy Door. The Holy Doors of the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland are so designated. This particular indulgenced act during the Year of Mercy may be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

In addition to this indulgenced act of passing through the Holy Doors, the remaining requirements for obtaining the indulgence applies. The remaining requirements include: offering the "Our Father" and the "Apostles Creed" in the visit to the church; praying one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the Holy Father's intentions (that is, the intentions designated by the Holy Father each month); worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day if you can get to Mass); making a sacramental confession within 20 days. Lastly, for a plenary indulgence, befrom all attachment to sin, even venial sin (otherwise, the indulgence is partial, not plenary, "full").

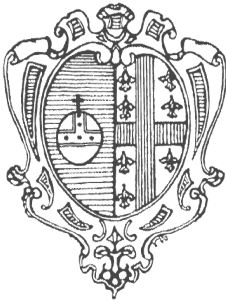

25TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST NOVEMBER 6, 2016

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF SOME ASPECTS OF THE MASS IN ITS EXTRAORDINARY FORM to acquire a "notable liturgical formation and a deep, personal familiarity with the earlier form of the liturgical celebration" (*Motu Proprio, Benedict XVI, July 2007*) or an exploration into the theological, historical, devotional, liturgical, ritualistic, architectural, artistic, linguistic, practical, legalistic, mystical... aspects of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Memento continued: 'Be mindful, O Lord, of Thy servants...'

'Pro quibus tibi offerimus vel qui tibi offerunt', 'for whom we offer, or who offer up to thee': These words mark an old tradition of the Church. In the first Centuries of the Church, each faithful would physically bring their own host and wine to be consecrated. For



practical reasons, the costume has been completely abandoned by the year 1000. The idea and prayer remains. It might even be noticed that the Novus Ordo of the Mass revived somehow this old tradition by introducing the procession of the gifts - bread and wine - carried by chosen faithful from the back of the church to the sanctuary.

The idea never left the Canon of

the Mass. As we come to Mass the priest and the faithful, behind him and in unity with him offer the same and unique Sacrifice. The priest, as an ordained cleric; the faithful, in virtue of their baptism. This is another point that the Fathers at Vatican II desired to underline. The idea of the universal priesthood shared by all- though in diverse degrees - is anchored in Tradition. Around the tenth century, the faithful instead of bringing participated through monetary offerings. That is the theological origin of the collection. What you place in the basket represent your degree of participation to the Sacrifice.

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
