I would like to thank one of our parishioners, **Josh Elsbernd**, and his company **Faultine Plumbing** for installing the backup pump and the alarm system in the Rectory. He, his company, and another parishioner, **Garett Wright**, donated the work. They worked during the summer months to install the system, completing the project last weekend. On behalf of all us, thank you Josh and Garett!



Work on the tower begins soon. The contractor, Oliver & Company from Richmond, California, have informed me that scaffolding will be installed soon. One of the decorative minor pinnacles fell several months ago during heavy rains and wind. The sub-contractor, Giampolini, will secure each of the minor pinnacles to the main spire with stainless steel cable. The decorative bulbs which run along the sides of the main spire will be secured with steel pins.

This work is not inexpensive. The contractor has estimated the cost to run at \$42,922. Thankfully we have the Building Fund which will help pay a portion of this amount. So, many thanks for your continued support for our Building Fund!

In addition to this, one of our faithful parishioners who passed away last year, **+Barbara Shadix**, had remembered our Parish in her will. Her bequest to us which we received only recently will also help pay a good portion of the cost. I am very thankful to her for remembering St. Margaret Mary.

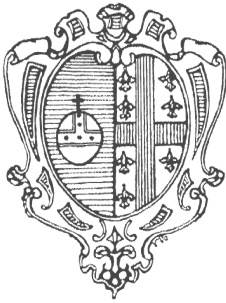

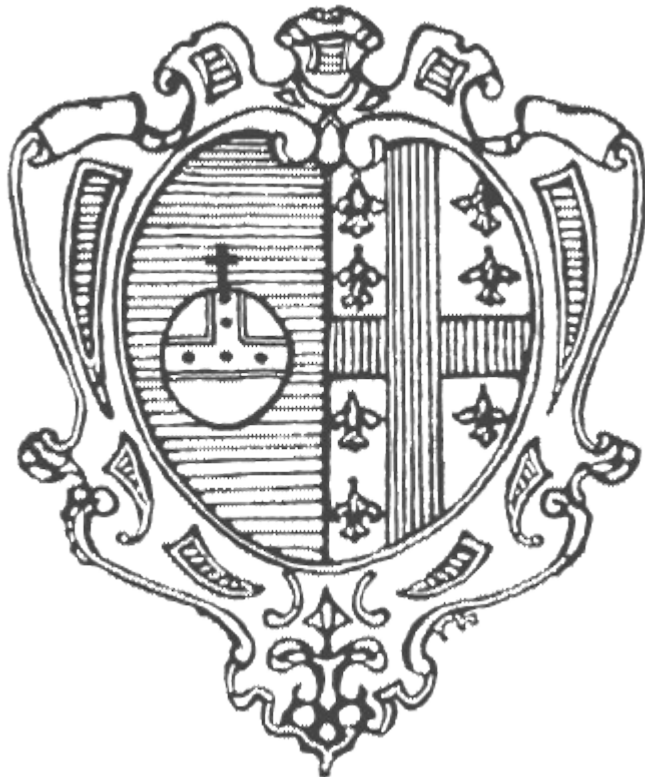

Una Cum Papa Nostro N. St. Cyprian explains that we are talking here common sense. It is clear and obvious that if we pray for the good and unity of the church, we pray for the One that is establish as its center, its Protector, the Rock, the head. Greek and Latin since the beginning of the Church have prayed for the Pope. The temptation to separate from the Vine is not new. Since the 5<sup>th</sup> Century some attempted to get independent, preferring to enter in schism and often heresies. Agobard, Bishop of Lyon in the 8<sup>th</sup> Century, wrote: "vehementer stupeo" at the idea of separating oneself from the

church. It means: “I am strongly astonished, amazed, surprised that some men of the church would hesitate to pray for the Successor of Peter”.

Et Antistite Nostro N. The Bishop is the local figure representing the Holy Father in this particular portion of land and souls he administers.

Et Rege Nostro. No leader holds his power but from God. Our Lord was pretty clear to Pilate. How are they accountable for such power? We certainly need to pray for them because they are ministers of God and they need help.

The letter “N” stands for “Nomen”. We do not pray for an ideal character being Pope, Bishop, President or King, but for the one given to us. He has a name. He is the one sitting in the chair of power and duties.

Et Omnibus Orthodoxis. These words have been added in the 10<sup>th</sup> Century. They seem to double the prayer of the “Memento” coming next. Atque Catholicae et Apostolicae Fidei Cultoribus. The Church is aware of the weakness of our faith and the necessity to have good and solid teachers.

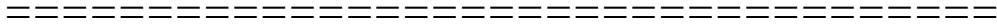

The Traditional Latin Mass (now called by the Holy Father: Mass in the *Extraordinary Form*) is brought to you through the ministry of the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*.

WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST?

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales.

Our motto is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

The Institute serves the faithful of the Bay since 2005 at St. Margaret Mary in Oakland and at Five Wounds in San Jose (Mass at 12:30 pm on Sunday, 12:15 pm on Weekdays but Sat. at 7:30 am)
